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Hi Anita,

You said, "A book is such a chore, isn't it?" YES, INDEED!! For a couple of years "the book" was all I thought about. I'd go to sleep thinking about... and wake up thinking about.... I neglected my house, my health, my appearance.

I originally thought FRANTZ FAMILIES -- KITH & KIN would be about 2000 pages. I started advertising pre-publication price of \$100. As word circulated, I received lots of additional info from folks who wanted to be included. The pages increased to 3200 pages!! I was still receiving info a month before publication (which was included in an addendum).

My database of Frantz info is in a genealogical software program called Roots3. (I have over 36,000 Frantz and collateral lines.) I exported my descendants of immigrant Michael Frantz to Word-for-Windows so I could enhance the appearance of the books. I was able to add names to the Index that would not appear in the Roots3 index. Fortunately, "Word" has a wonderful indexing system so when I was ready for the absolute final Index, it worked beautifully. (Approximately 28,000 names in the three books indexes.)

I'm a 61 year old full-time working widow with limited resources. The book project was really too much work for one person and too expensive for me. However, I didn't want to abandon the project because many folks were anticipating the books. I kept going full-speed.

I couldn't send the material to a genealogical publishing company because their cost was prohibitive. I ended up taking the "camera ready" pages to my local Kinko's. Then I hauled home about fifty boxes full of pages and I bound the books. Finally, I packed them into big boxes and hauled them to the Post Office. Frankly, the only way I was able to accomplish the project was because about sixty families and a few libraries sent their \$100 in advance of publication.

Yes, "a book is such a chore, isn't it?" However, I'm glad I did it!! Now I can search for additional info -- on the internet -- to enhance the info I have on the Frantz family.

Good luck with your book project. Don't despair. Keep on keeping on.
