DeWALT GARST, is supposedly of Dutch descent, and French mixture, and according to family tradition, his wife is of the same nationality. They evidently were married one or two years before coming to America, and if Nicholas is a son, then they had two sons when they came here, Nicholas and Frederick.

DeWalt and Nicholas were in the Revolutionary struggle, and it is probable that Frederick was, however I have no record of his service. DeWalt served as a private in Captain Mathias Hannings Company Eightysecond Battalion, Lancaster County, Militia, as taken for the year 1782. (See Page 184, Vol. 7, Pennsylvania Archives, 5th series)

There seems to be no further war record in the family until we come down to Michael and Elias Garst, who served in the Civil War, same Company (153 Ohio Volunteer Infentry) and attachment; Michael serving as Sergeant and Corporal.

DeWalt Garst was a farmer and one of the early settlers of (old) Lancaster Co., Pa.

Following is a tabulation of the family as I have been able to gather information, most of which is authentic and reliable, some of which is historically correct.

I accept it as fact that David Frantz, grandson of Michael Frantz, 1st Elder of the Conestoga Congregation, married a daughter of this Devalt Carst, on the word of Frank L. Carst, of Stanford, Ill., who wrote me in a letter that " He had often heard his father say that his father ( Abraham Gorat, II) and mother (Anna Frantz Garst) were 1st. cousins ". As there are no other Frantz connections, it must follow that Abraham Garst and Elizaboth Garst Frantz, wife of David Frantz and mother of Abraham II's wife must have been brother and sister. In other words, more simple to understand, -- Abraham Garst's father and his wife's nother were IN brother and sister.

After the death of David Frantz in Va., about 1814, Elizabeth married Leonard Houtz and they and all of David's children Except Samuel, moved to Logan Co., Ohio, near Bellefontaine, where there are many descendants, mostly of other names than Frantz, although there are quite a few of that name there, and in sur,

rounding counties.

There may be a remote chance that the wives of Christian and Daniel Frantz, brothers of David, the both married Garsts, may have been daughters of this Devalt, and who have not been name ed in any family record, as the children of this family doky not soom to be verified by any court record which I have been able to locate up to now, but are mainly a matter of family tradition. # Immigration.

Dewalt Garst came to America on the ship "Patience" on Saturday the 11th day of August, 1750, Hugh Steel, master, from Rotterdam, but last from Cowes in England. The mark of Dewalt Garst was in the form of a "W2"

Also on the same ship is the name of Nicholas Gerst.

## Early tax records.

In 1771, was taxed for 100 acres of land, 2 horses and 2 cows, the tax amount was 3 shillings.

In 1771, In Bethel Twp., Lancaster Co., Pa., Nicholas Gerst was taxed for 170 acres, 2 horses and 2 cows, and the amount was 6 shillings.

In 1781, George Gerst lived in Robeson Twp., Berks Co., Pa., owned 100 acres of land, and was taxed 1 pound and 5 pence.

Note -- The only daughter of Michael Frantz, was reported to have married a George Gerst.

In 1784, Henry Gerst lived in Exeter Twp., Berks Co., Pa., owned 147 acres. No tax.

Dear sir and I am presuming, Cousin: --- Your letter asking about my records of the Garst and Frantz families, came to hand duly and I am going to answer as best I can.

I know very little about the Frantz families and can only

give you meagre information.

You have the Garst records partly correct. The first one should read; (DeWalt Carst and Marie (Stathalter) garst married in France or England -- (there is quite a controversy about this as the Garsts (or Kersts want from Holland or Germany into Alsace Loraine to escape the army draft and changed their name to Garst under Franch rule, then the French instituted the graft system so they moved to England and lived in or near Barstown, -ngland which Town is still on the map. From there they set sail from Amsterdam Holland on a Dutch ship for America. (The above is part history and part tradition)

Now it is very possible that she is the Anna Frantz you refer to as -- instead of Anna Garst, born.

All I can tell you is the above, just had this much of the Anna Frantz record from my father. Do not know who she was or how many sister she had or any thing about her descent, but am inclined to think Anna Frantz marrying a Garst has mixed some one on the names possibly.

Abroham Garst the first married a second time and raised a large family-- who are scattered all over the U.S.

If myou can it any time tell me surely about Anna Frantz parentage I wish you keep me in mind, am sorry I did not start his linneage sooner in life.

There were formerly-- along in the 1885 and 6 dates, many Frantz families around Springfield Chio, but I never knew many of them as I was only there one year. Simmion Frantz married a Garst girl named Ella Garst, and they live near or in New Carlisle, O.
