Enclosed find several printouts re: Flora. I'm sending identical pages hoping that one of you will confirm the relationship. It is obvious that the connection is there but the birthdates are a little bit different. I hesitate to make connections (in the computer) if I don't have something to base it on.

It's a few days before Christmas and I'm truly blessed! The boss is gone until the middle of next week. Most of the co-workers are taking vacations. There is a limited amount of work to do in the office. All I have to do is sit here and answer the phone (but there are very few phone calls.)

Where I leave out info, I put the three or four dots at the end of the sentence. really impressed with the extent of Dore's research (all over again, I am impressed). He seems to have been very tenatious about collecting and documenting. (A man after my own heart!!)

As I work with his information, I see areas where I should do some more research. It would be better for the books if I did the research and confirm some of his data. However, if I wait to publish until I've checked and double-checked, I might never get the books into print. Frankly, I'm very suspect of some of our "tradition" data. Maybe I'll be able to eventually do research in Pennsylvania and unravel some of the duplication of names against land records and wills. Maybe, when the books are out, others will "jump on the band-wagon" and help me with documentation.

I mailed over 240 Christmas cards and 230 with newsletters. I have received five more orders for Frantz Families -- Kith & Kin. I'm grateful for the extra orders but still not enough to bring the cost of publication down. (52 or 53 now, I think.)

It sounds like the Studebaker's really put on a remarkable reunion. plans are always "subject to change" but that's my plan right (Let the co-workers take days off during the holidays. I'll take my vacation(s) next year!!!!!!) I kept hoping that the Studebaker Family Association would buy a set of books for their library but no such luck. In fact, I'm very disappointed because two of the co-authors haven't expressed enough interest to order the books. I hope they aren't waiting for me to give them a set. Already, I will have the cost of two sets for the copyright office. I have planned to give a set to Allen County Public Library and a set to Family History Center, Salt Lake City, Utah. I'm "on the fence" about whether to give a set to the Church of the Brethren Archives in Elgin, Illinois. Right there is over \$400 (or \$500). they expect me to give them copies? (But don't, don't, don't say a word to them, Lela. We are just having "girl talk." OK????)
