# Abraham Denlinger

Abraham Denlinger was born in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania August 4, 1806, son of Abraham and Anna (Neff) Denlinger. His parents died when he was quite young and he lived with his grandfather until he was seventeen. Subsequently, for several years he learned the blacksmith trade from Amos Cooper near Lancaster and farmed. "Being dissatisfied with the opportunities offered to young men in that section," he came to Ohio with his brother John in 1831 to survey the situation. They liked what they saw and together they bought 278 1/2 acres of land from Peter Dietrich, executor of the will of Daniel Jacobs, in Section 1 of Madison Township.

On May 10th of 1832 he was married by George Olinger to Margaret Miller, 6 daughter of Daniel and Susan (Bowman) Miller and a native of Montgomery County. The next year (1833) his brother John married Sarah Miller, Margaret's sister.

In October of 1832 the two brothers divided their land with Abraham retaining 139 1/2 acres. Margaret signed her name to the joint deed. Here about 1837 the couple built a large brick two-story home where they lived for the rest of their lives. This house is still standing today in very good repair with

access off Basore Road. A recent tour of the home given to us by the present owners, Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Allbright, revealed lovely walnut and ash floors and woodwork, much of the original hardware on the doors and spacious, high-ceilinged rooms. The exterior has been covered with stucco necessitated by the porousness of the handmade bricks. Much modernizing and remodeling has been done, but the original plain charm of the house remains intact.

Other land was acquired over the years until Abraham Denlinger owned 400 acres of Madison Township.

Abraham Denlinger put his talent as a blacksmith and an inventive mind together and produced a wire hay rake, the first in the county. This being very successful, he made and sold between five and six thousand of them over the years.

He was "noted for his strength of character and decisive opinions on all the leading questions of the time." This sounds as though he might have been stubborn and opinionated! Strength of character he must have had because Beers tells how he cured himself of dropsy by a regular cold water treatment continued over three years. He retained his fidelity to the Society of Friends until the end of his life although his wife and children were devout Dunkers. Although never a Quaker himself, he attended meeting at a Friends' Meeting House on the southeast corner of Little York Road and Peters Pike in Butler Township. 10

Abraham and Margaret Denlinger had seven children: John W., Daniel, Abraham A., David, Israel, Mary and Joseph. Of these only four reared families of their own. Of John W., more later. Daniel was born November 28, 1834 but no more is known of him. Abraham A., born February 25, 1836 married twice (first to Sarah Garber, second to Anna Bowman), raised thirteen children and

died December 31, 1897. One of these children, Edgar Garber Denlinger became a lawyer and prosecuting attorney for Montgomery County. David, Pickett's Mich, MAV, born March 28, 1838, was killed at Atlanta, Georgia in December 1864, serving with the Union Army. Israel, born June 7, 1840, married Mary Garber, a sister of Sarah (Abraham A.'s first wife) and died February 13, 1917. A genealogy of the Israel Denlinger family has been compiled by Mrs. Bauman. Mary Ann was born September 14, 1843 and died June 20, 1919. She married Amos Hyre and reared a large family. Of the youngest son, Joseph, nothing is known.

John W., the eldest of Abraham Denlinger's children, was born April 9, 1833. He married Anna Christian, daughter of Samuel and Mary Colclessor Christian (q.v.) on February 18, 1858. They became parents of thirteen Seventh children, the eldest of whom was Dean E. Denlinger's grandfather, Leroy Denlinger. John W. Denlinger located in the northwest quarter of Section 1, Madison Township and rebuilt the house there which had formerly been owned by Casper Beck. The house was torn down and rebuilt using much of the same materials when Leroy was approximately ten years old or about 1883. This house and outbuildings are still standing but are in bad repair. The land is now owned by Good Samaritan Hospital which is building a large complex of buildings for elderly people nearby so the days of the house are probably numbered. The home can easily be seen on the corner of Westbrook Road and Denlinger Road.

The families of the Denlinger brothers, being double first cousins and living on adjoining farms, grew up very intimately together. They attended school in a building on the corner of what is now Shiloh Springs Road and



Denlinger Road. They married and kept in close touch while rearing their families. They all were nurtured in the German Baptist faith but when the division of the church occurred in 1881, John W. Denlinger's family was the only one to stay with the Church of the Brethren. The children of John and Sarah Denlinger went with the Old Orders as did Israel Denlinger and Mary Ann Hyre, John W.'s brother and sister. Abraham A. Denlinger was never a member of the Dunker church. The bitter feelings engendered by the split in the church manifested themselves within the family group and the close ties of years were severed. Never again did the John W. Denlinger family visit in the homes of their cousins and subsequent generations grew up not knowing their Denlinger relatives.

Margaret Miller Denlinger died on April 5, 1863 and in 1865, Abraham was married again to Eliza Linville of Pennsylvania. He lived for another twenty-eight years, dying on September 25, 1893. He and Margaret are buried in Ehrstine Cemetery on Olive Road in Madison Township. Of the second Mrs. Denlinger, I know nothing more. The is buried in Ehrstine willtraham this first wife. (Name on back of his tomb).

JOHN DENLINGER was born on June 14, 1809 in Lancaster County, Pa,. to Abraham I (9/26/1776-5/4/1819) and Anna (Funk-Neff) Denlinger (9/9/1780-10/28/1816).

John's mother died in 1816 when she was just 36 years old. She had 11 children, the youngest one was 1 year old when she died, and only 4 years old when her father died. John's father died in 1819 at age 42.

This is purely speculation, but I imagine that the two oldest daughters: Elizabeth (16) and Barbara (14) helped their father keep the family together until he died.

We don't have a date of marriage for Elizabeth, she may have married before her fathers death, but Barbara was married after his death.

<u>John</u> received from his father's will: His small new chest and one equal eleventh part from sale of property.

I haven't found out where these children were raised after their parents deaths. It is believed Abraham II was in a Quaker home.

<u>John. age 21.</u> and Abraham II, age 24, came to Montgomery County, Ohio around 1830. They met and married sisters. Margaret (Rebecca) and <u>Sarah Miller</u>.

It is quite possible that <u>John</u> and Abraham used the money from their inheritance to come to Ohio.

John and Sarah were married 4/14/1833 in Harrison Town-ship by Squire G. Olinger.

<u>Sarah</u> was the daughter of Daniel Miller (an early settler of Dayton). Daniel owned most of what is now known as Westwood.
