> I heard by the "grapevine" that the Naval Museum in London has ships > lists of the Palatine Emigration from Europe. Now I don't have any other > information, but usually figure where there is smoke there is fire. The > "grapevine" did not know how much information they contained, but they were > working on finding out. I'm just passing this bit of news on so that anyone > interested might want to check it out. Never know where those pieces of the > puzzle are!!!!

The grapevine is well-meaning, but mistaken: the National Maritime Museum in Greenwich has *no* ship lists of the Palatine emigration from Europe. However, the Public Record Office in Kew *does* hold the following records of the Palatine emigration of 1709/10 to New York:

Lists of Germans from the Palatinate Who Came To England in 1709, compiled by John Tribbeko and George Ruperti, PRO, C.O. 388/76/56, 56i, 56ii, 64, and 68-70. Familiarly known as the "London Lists".

N.Y. Palatine Subsistence Lists of Governor Robert Hunter, 1710-1712, PRO, C.O. 5/1230 and 1231. Familiarly known as the "Hunter Lists".

Palatine Embarkation Lists from Rotterdam, Holland, 1709, PRO, T 1/119/6-10, 19-26, 58-65, 68-72, and 79-82. Familiarly known as the "Rotterdam Lists".

Palatines Returned to Holland, 1709 & 1711, PRO, T. 1/119 136-153; T 1/125/203-204, 221-224, 230-232; and T 1/132/167-170.

These records are well known to researchers of the 1709/10 migration, and have been used extensively by Henry Z. Jones, Jr., in his work _The Palatine Families of New York; A Study of the German Immigrants Who Arrived in Colonial New York in 1710 (2 vols.; Studio City, CA: the author, 1985; reprinted Camden, ME: Picton Press, 1995).
