

Dear Dudley:

It was so nice to hear from you once again. I have some data that seems to go along with the photocopies you sent me, so I will elucidate on those items. Perhaps you know the proper person to send the following along to. My resource for the following is: <u>Eighteenth Century Emigrants</u>, Vol. II, <u>The Western Palatinate</u>, by Annette Kunselman Burgert, (1985), Birdsboro, Pennsylvania: "The Pennsylvania German Society." This is a marvelous book which traces a Palatinate individual from his home village, to his new location in North America.

Adam DIEHL, age 28, came to America in 1737, aboard the Virtuous Grace, [along with "our" Johann Georg Hock. Adam Diehl obtained his manumission permit from Zweibrücken in 1737, which gave him permission to emigrate. He was a son of Theobald Diehl of Pfeffelbach in Oberamt Lichtenberg, m. 02 May 1730 Juliana Margaretha Remy, (bp. 31 May 1711: Mimbach-Webenheim Reformed Church), daughter of Barthel Remy & Anna Elisabetha of Webenheim. [After becoming a widower (17 July 1716), Barthel Remy, married a second time 08 Dec. 1718 Christina Schunck, and at age 54, also migrated with them, along with Barthel's son, Jacob, age 18.]

Adam DIEHL, age 52, came to America in 1739, aboard the Samuel, along with his two sons: Carl (22), and Daniel (26). Johann Adam Diehl was confirmed in 1704 (Herren-Sulzbach Lutheran Church), and was a son of Hans Georg Diehl of Cappeln. Johann Adam Diehl m. 12 April 1713, Maria Catharina Kreischer, daughter of Johann Daniel Kreischer of Homberg and Anna Catharina Esch. She was bp. 28 October 1696, Herren-Sulzbach Lutheran.

J. Frederick DIEHL: aboard the "Squirrel,", 21 Oct. 1761, m. Magdalena Harley and had 9 children. He settled among the "Skippack Brethren" in Montgomery Co., Pa. Some of their children were active in the church in Marsh Creek, Pa.

His brother <u>Philip Diehl</u>, also migrated with him. They both were members of the Great Swamp (Bucks Co., Pa.) and ca. 1799, the Conewago congregations.

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Jacob DIEHL migrated ca. 1747 to Lebanon Twp., Lancaster Co., Pa. and was initially active in the Conestoga Congregation and ca. 1770, the Little Swatara congregation. His son Abraham, migrated ca. 1804 to Rockingham Co., Va. Another son of Jacob's, Christian Diehl, lived in Dauphin Co., ca. 1790, and had 5 sons and 2 daughters.

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John DIEHL lived in Frederick Co., Maryland ca. 1783 and was a member of the Beaver Dam Congregation. He had 8 children.

Michael Frantz b. 1687 near Basel, Switzerland, bp. in 1734 by Peter Becker and became an Elder of the Conestoga Congregation in Lancaster Co., Pa., d. 1748. He migrated to the U.S.A. in 1729. with a daughter and son, Michael, Jr. b. 1725, and settled in Lancaster Co., Pa.

Michael Frantz, Jr., b. 1725, bp. 1748, m. 1748 Magdalena Zug. They had 8 sons, and 1 daughter and they all migrated to Botetourt County, Virginia in 1784.

Michael Frantz, Sr., Christian Frantz, and Balser Frantz were all brothers and initially located themselves in Lancaster Co., Pa. Christian (bp. 1735 Conestoga congregation, d. 1739) and married Anna, by whom they had 8 children.

Balser Frantz (bp. 1735 Conestoga congregation, d. 1747) m. Anna Barbara Hannah, by whom they had 6 children.

Christian Frantz, Jr. was an early organizer of the Little Swatara Congregation in Tulpehocken Twp.

There is a publication: <u>The Genealogy of Matthias Frantz Family</u>, by E. H. Frantz & others, (1972).

I also correspond with a Gish researcher who published: Christian Gish of Virginia, by Josephine Costello Huffaker, Gateway Press, Inc., Baltimore, Md. (1989). Her address is: 5242 Ridgedale Drive, Dallas, Texas 75206. I believe the Gish lineage also involves the Frantz lines. [The reason for my interest is that Christian Gish married Sophia Hock, a daughter of our Hans Georg Hock.]

Thank you for sending the photocopies regarding the Hokes. Yes, I have seen these particular Hoke names and some of them are lineages of Andreas Hock (a brother of our Hans Georg Hock). Some of these names are involved with the named Johann Jakob Hoke lineage. There are a couple of ladies from Green Springs, Ohio who recently compiled a Hoke book which involved this lineage completely. If you are interested, I could dig out my notice somewhere, but I also know that it is available on microfilm from the L.D.S. branch libraries. It appears to be a well-documented book and someday, I would like to really examine this collection more closely.

I was wondering if you have any of the following photocopies:

- 1-22 August 1734: Warrant, Michael Downer, 265 acres in Lebanon Twp., Lancaster Co., Pa.
- 2- 15 November 1751: Michael Downer sold his 265 acres to his son John Downer.
- 3- A document showing the description of the property John Downer, Sr. received from his father's estate, by will.
- 4- 15 October 1792: Draft of 132 acre survey to <u>Joseph Downer</u> [part of the 265 acres.]
- 5- 25 July 1798: Draft of tract of land divided for <u>John Downer</u>, <u>Sr.</u> for his sons, Joseph and John Downer, Jr.
- 6-06 September 1798: John Downer, Sr. sold 260 acres to his son, Joseph.
- 7- 1805: Draft of 5 acres in Lebanon Twp., Dauphin Co., Pa.

What I am specifically looking for is a description of the 265 acres and whose properties it adjoined during this particular period of time. I am wondering if within a certain property description is named a George Hock-Hoke or any Hoke?

My problem, which I am still trying to resolve, is that there has never been a Warrantee map drawn of Lebanon Township! I have not been able to pinpoint the location of our emigrant from his arrival in 1737 until approximately 1760! A man in California is in the process of compiling these needed drafts but is going township by township until the entire Lebanon County is drawn! He is doing a remarkable job and it is truly a difficult feat but I need it now! I actually needed it before our book was published but ----! This work is NEVER completed, is it?

If I can be of further help to you, please let me know. I really enjoyed reading the Dohner books and I am most appreciative of your generosity, thank you very much. I wish more researchers would be as cooperative as you have been - just imagine how much work could be accomplished!
